Take advantage of our Annual Worm Egg Count Package

A faecal worm egg count (FWEC) is used to estimate the level of worm burden in your horse and to determine whether a worming treatment is required. FWECs are an important tool for worm control and should be conducted every 12 weeks for adult horses during the grazing season. Equisal tapeworm tests are recommended every 6 months, ideally in Spring and Autumn.

Our annual worm control package is designed to offer tailored, responsible worming guided by regular worm egg counts.

What is Included in Our Annual Worm Control Package?

Our comprehensive horse worming programme, suitable for horses aged 2 years and older, includes:

- 4 x faecal worm egg counts
- 1 x weigh tape
- 2 x Equisal tapework saliva tests
- Unlimited and up-to-date advice from our knowledgeable equine vets, ensuring that you receive the guidance and support you need throughout the year

This year, Jemma is hoping to step up to competing full time at 90cm on Orb and ideally go BE with the view of potentially qualifying for Badminton Grassroots. She would love to qualify for the Horse Events Championships at Dauntsey for the second year running and the Cotswold Cup final.

Strangles Vaccination now available!

Strangles is a highly contagious bacterial disease which causes infection of the lymph nodes of the head and neck. All equines can be affected and are often very unwell with this disease. Strangles can result in lymph node abscessation and these abscesses often rupture, creating draining infectious lesions.

Outbreaks result in long periods of yard lockdown and isolation, causing serious economic issues on professional yards and hours of stress and worry for horse owners.

Vaccination offers the best form of protection and you can book your vaccination for £60.00 including VAT. Vaccinations are available on our FREE zone visit scheme so book today. The second vaccination is to be booked 4 weeks after the initial vaccination and boosters are required between 6 and 12 months.

How to rein in the impact of Strangles

Strangles is a highly contagious bacterial infection of the lymph nodes of the head and neck caused by the bacterium, *Streptococcus equi*subspecies *equi*(*S. equiequi*).

Clinical signs can vary between horses and signs to look out for include:

- Fever, usually at least 39-40°C or 102.5-104°F (this is usually the first clinical sign to occur)
- Swollen and painful lymph nodes around the head and neck leading to abscesses
- Difficulty swallowing and breathing and abnormal respiratory noises
- Cough
- Depression and loss of appetite
- A runny nose (watery to begin with, but becoming thick pus within days)

There is also a form of the disease known as 'atypical strangles' which is when horses only show very mild clinical signs, but they are still infectious.

Some cases develop serious complications such as 'bastard strangles' and purpura haemorrhagica; bastard strangles is when abscesses form in different areas of the body, while purpura haemorrhagica is inflammation of the blood vessels which leads to swelling (oedema). This can occur under the belly, limbs and the sheath. There are often small areas of bruising/bleeding on the mucous membranes (gums and eyes).

Vaccination is a useful management tool, alongside good stable management and biosecurity measures, and can play a really important role in improving herd immunity and reducing the number of strangles cases in the equine population.
